

# FRANCE'S PLANS AND TROUBLES.

## STRENGTHENING THE FORCES IN ALGERIA—

### A DEMAND FROM SPAIN.

PARIS, June 29.—The *Télégraphe* states that Gen. Farre, Minister of War, is considering the question of increasing materially and permanently the strength of the forces in Algeria.

M. Barthélemy St. Hilaire, Minister of Foreign Affairs, has addressed a fresh and energetic note to the Porte, complaining of the warlike attitude of the Turkish Governor of Tripoli.

Spain demands compensation for losses to Spanish subjects in Oran caused by insurgent raids.

MADRID, June 29.—The *Imparcial* says: "We have received mail advices, which the French censorship did not permit to be telegraphed, to the effect that the Military Governor of Oran has been hissed in the streets. A belief is prevailing that the military deal half-heartedly with the insurrection, as it is wished to throw discredit on the civil administration in Algeria."

TUNIS, June 29.—The Bey has sent 1,200 troops to Sfax to subdue the tribes who have assumed a defiant attitude against the Bey.

LONDON, June 29.—A correspondent at Madrid says: "The irritation against France is spreading in Spain. The French journals and authorities are accused of concealing the fact that 1,700 Spaniards have perished in Oran in Arab raids. Many Spanish refugees are arriving from Oran."
