

THE TUNISIAN EXPEDITION.

PARIS, Nov. 11.—A semi-official dispatch from Tunis says: “Gen. Saussier will leave Kairwan to-day for Gafsa. Gen. Logerot’s column will start for Gabes to-morrow.”

In the Chamber of Deputies to-day, Gen. Farre, the retiring Minister of War, presented a bill for a supplementary vote of 28,000,000*f.* for the Tunis and Oran expeditions.

LONDON, Nov. 11.—A dispatch from Sfax says: “Unless further orders were received the expedition in Southern Tunis was to begin to move yesterday. The expedition is openly said to be useless.”

LONDON, Nov. 12.—A correspondent at Tunis says: “The expedition to the south will be gone two months. After this only 15,000 men are to remain in Tunis. A local mixed army will then be organized.”
