Paris, July 5, 5:50 evening.

The Council of Ministers met in the morning. It dealt with the affairs of Algeria. The government ordered the bombardment of Sfax. It is probable that the order was carried out yesterday.

General Saussier will immediately take possession of his station.

If M. Albert Grévy gives his resignation, General Saussier will be in charge of the civil and military functions.

New troops will not be sent to Algeria. The force current are more than sufficient to counter all the possibilities.

- Mr. Jules Ferry, in spite of the adoption of the Simon amendment in the Senate, will not withdraw the project concerning with obligatory education.

It is believed that the chamber will block the amendment and that the Senate will not insist.

- General Osmont, learning of the nomination of General Saussier, has telegraphed to Paris that he should be credited for the general provisions that had been taken, and that the energy and spirit of the chiefs of police would have been enough to prevent any agitation.

It is believed that colonel Mallaret will be made inactive.
