The nomination of General Saussier to the the command of the 19th Corps in Algiers is regarded as the forerunner of the withdrawal of Mr. Albert Grevy. One can be assured, furthermore, from the Bourbon Palace, that the general carries a sealed envelope that he should open only in the event of resignation of the governor, and which confers on him all the military and civil authority for the administration of our colony.

Other news accredited in the corridors of the Chamber is that Sfax was bombarded yesterday. If the news did not yet arrive here, it is due to the rupture of the cable. At all events, there has been among our government, for forty-eight hours, an

excitement that pushes them to extreme measures. One attempts to repair faults committed, which is extremely creditable; but shouldn't we fear that too much haste tends to compromise the affairs rather than improve them? Moreover it should not be forgotten that the revocations never improve anything, except to disorganize the military and to discourage the command when one does not have men in hand who are experienced and who possess of the confidence of the troops.
