### Tunisia

Written from Sfax, on November 12:

“Not a week passes without the arrival from Tripoli of former Tunisian insurrectionists, men women and children, trailing behind them their camels, asses, sheep, horses and watchdogs which the women hold on a leash with a cord attached to the belt.

“Arriving in hundreds at the same time, they disembark holding in the hand the card delivered them by the general consul of France in Tripoli, to who they made their submission and who, on their request, repatriated them.

“These unhappy souls, the majority worn out by misery, are the last of the rebels from Tunisia. They tell that they would have returned a long time ago if the overland route had been safe, but that at the border they would be exposed to hazards on this side. They all preferred to embark in Tripoli.

“They affirm that no Tunisian insurrectionists remain any longer in the interior of Tripolitania. The last all came to camp near the city; they made their submission, and the French Consul would embark them as soon as he had a ship to hand.

“It is thus completely finished with the Tunisian rebels. In the last two months more than 6,000 returned from there to Sfax. ”
