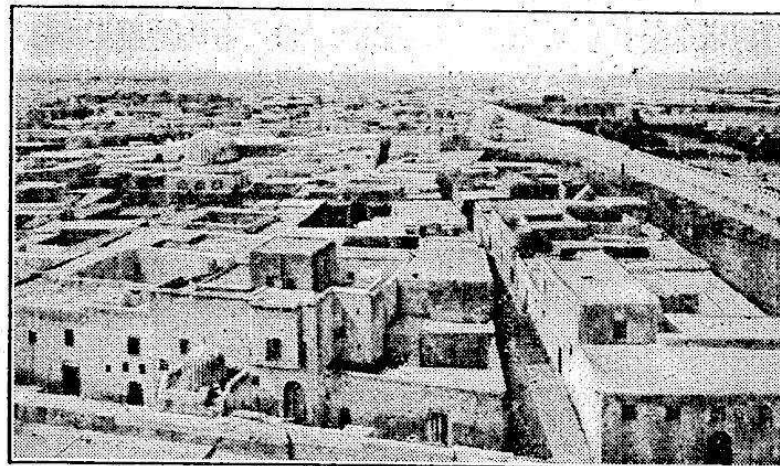
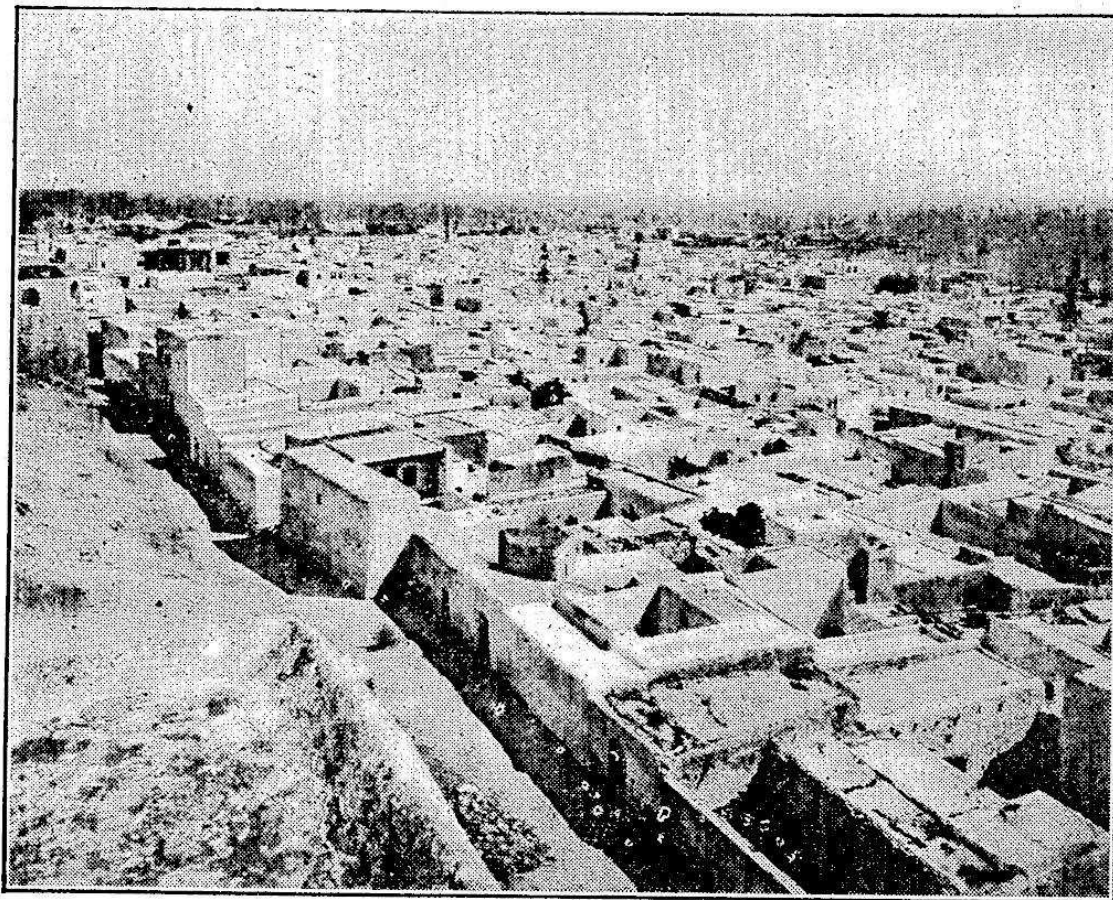


SOUSSE AND KAIROUAN: THE ADVANCE IN TUNISIA

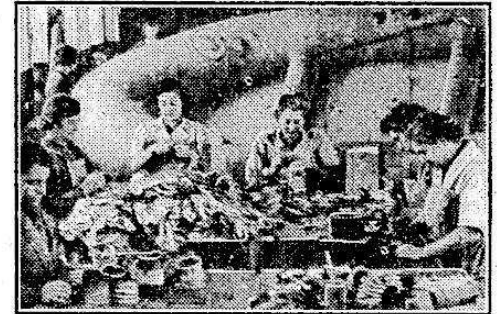
BUDGET DAY.—The Chancellor of the Exchequer and Lady Wood leaving Downing Street for the House of Commons yesterday.
