

French Lift Curfew In Tunis For Ramadan

TUNIS, Tunisia, May 18 (AP)—French Resident-Gen. Jean de Hauteclocque announced today the nightly curfew, imposed by French military authorities, would be lifted during Ramadan, beginning about May 24.

During Ramadan Moslems are supposed to touch neither food nor drink between the hours of sunrise and sunset. After fasting all day, they feast during the night. The curfew, which confined them to their homes, would have been difficult if not impossible to enforce during Ramadan.

Tunisia was quiet today except for the explosion of a small bomb in a letter box at the central post office of Sfax in Southern Tunisia. There were no casualties.
